Joe and I have been really looking forward to our Liberal flyout. A friend of mine had donated his 3/4 scale P-51 to the museum, and I was looking forward to seeing it again, albeit in captivity and not out in the wild blue yonder.

The Bonanza was fresh out of annual and I took a friend along for a 2 hour maintenance flight on Friday to ensure both the pilot and plane were ready to go. Six positive gear extensions/retractions and the last landing in to ICT was so smooth my safety pilot joked he couldn't tell when we quit flying.

Saturday, the weather was beautiful, the course easy breezy; no pesky terrain or limited visibility. The plane was fueled and waiting on us and our VFR flight plan was filed. I was sure to



get in a little early and watch my KPA cohorts nail their landings. Carefully followed my Before Start Checklist. All good.

N81HB fired right up and I continued through the Start and After Start checklists. Hmmm. That LDG GR & THROTTLE breaker looked out a little far. Running my hand along the circuit breakers just as I did during the Before Start Checklist, yup. That wasn't out before start. Ok. I have one shot to reset. I taxied out, completed the run up, pressed the breaker and No Joy. And no happy 3 green gear down lights! With no way to determine the gear position, we headed back to the FBO. (Yes, I knew the gear was down but that would be the last time I could be certain of the gear's position.)

Just in case I didn't press the breaker correctly, once we were unloaded, I pressed it just to see. It stayed in. Flipped the battery switch on and blew the breaker. We were done. Monday morning comes and my shop is booked up. They may get to it next week or not. In over 20 years of flying this is my very first breaker issue. And that is why every single flight, I go down the checklist every single time.
